

Mebeverine hydrochloride 150mg/5ml Oral Suspension

Read all of this leaflet carefully before you start taking this medicine because it contains important information for you.

- ▶ Keep this leaflet. You may need to read it again.
- ▶ If you have any further questions, ask your doctor or pharmacist.
- ▶ This medicine has been prescribed for you only. Do not pass it on to others. It may harm them, even if their signs of illness are the same as yours.
- ▶ If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet. See section 4.

The name of your medicine is Mebeverine hydrochloride 150mg/5ml Oral Suspension but it will be referred to as 'Mebeverine' throughout this leaflet.

1. What Mebeverine is and what it is used for

This medicinal product contains mebeverine which is an antispasmodic.

It is used to treat the symptoms of a variety of bowel problems and works by relaxing the muscles in the gut, thereby relieving the symptoms of irritable bowel:

- ▶ colicky abdominal pain and cramps
- ▶ persistent diarrhoea where there is no obvious cause (this may or may not occur between bouts of constipation)
- ▶ wind.

Mebeverine can also be used for spasm in the gut resulting from certain other diseases.

You must talk to a doctor if you do not feel better or if you feel worse.

2. What you need to know before you take Mebeverine

Do not take Mebeverine

- ▶ if you are allergic to mebeverine or to any of the other ingredients of this medicine (listed in section 6). If this applies to you, speak to your doctor or pharmacist.

Other medicines and Mebeverine

Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking, have recently taken or might take any other medicines. Some medicines may be affected by Mebeverine or they may affect how well Mebeverine will work.

Pregnancy and breast-feeding

If you are pregnant or breast-feeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby, ask your doctor for advice before taking this medicine.

Driving and using machines

Mebeverine is unlikely to affect your ability to operate machinery or to drive.

Mebeverine contains

Sodium benzoate (E 211): This medicine contains 10.00mg sodium benzoate (E 211) in each 5ml which is equivalent to 2.00mg /ml of oral suspension.

Macrogolglycerol 40 Hydroxystearate: May cause stomach upset and diarrhea.

Propylene glycol (E 1520): This medicine contains 6.5mg propylene glycol in each 5ml dose which is equivalent to 1.3mg/ml.

Sodium: This medicine contains 41.90 mg sodium in each 5ml. This is equivalent to 2.095% of the recommended maximum daily dietary intake of sodium for an adult.

3. How to take Mebeverine

Always take this medicine exactly as your doctor has told you. Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

The recommended dose is

Adults and children over 10 years of age

The usual dose is 5 ml three times a day.

The dose may be gradually reduced after a few weeks when your condition improves.

Use in children under 10 years

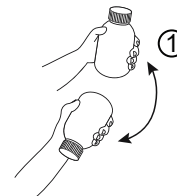
This medicine is NOT suitable for children under 10 years.

Route and Method of administration:

- ▶ This medicinal product must be taken orally.
- ▶ Shake the suspension before taking.
- ▶ Take the suspension preferably 20 minutes before meals to reduce symptoms after eating.
- ▶ Your doctor may also advise you to start or stop taking other medicines, depending on what condition you're being treated for and the way you respond to treatment.
- ▶ **Always take the full dose** that your doctor has prescribed. Never take only part of a dose.
- ▶ Your doctor or pharmacist may advise you to take a required dose using 5ml oral syringe provided with 125ml pack.

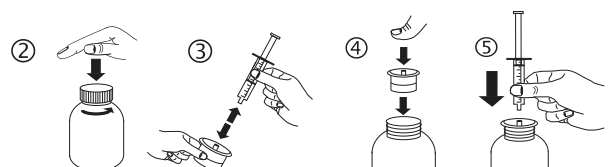
Instructions for the use of syringe:

- a) Shake bottle well before use (figure 1).

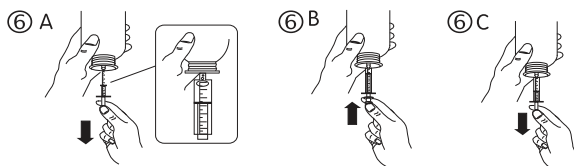


- b) Open the bottle: press the cap and turn it anticlockwise (figure 2).

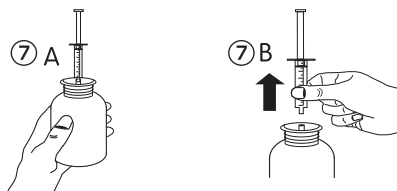
- c) Separate the adaptor from the syringe (figure 3). Insert the adaptor into the bottle neck (figure 4). Ensure it is properly fixed. Take the syringe and put it in the adaptor opening (figure 5).



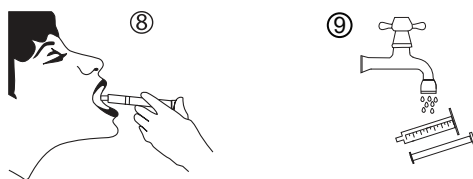
- d) Turn the bottle upside down. Fill the syringe with a small amount of suspension by pulling the piston down (figure 6A), then push the piston upwards in order to remove any possible bubble (figure 6B). Pull the piston down to the graduation mark corresponding to the quantity in millilitres (ml) prescribed by your doctor (figure 6C).



- e) Turn the bottle the right way up (figure 7A). Remove the syringe from the adaptor (figure 7B).



- f) Empty the contents of the syringe into the patient's mouth by pushing the piston to the bottom of the syringe (figure 8). The contents of the syringe should be emptied into the side cheek of the patient's mouth to avoid a choking hazard. Close the bottle with the plastic screw cap. Wash the syringe with water (figure 9).



If you take more Mebeverine than you should

1. Tell your doctor, pharmacist or nearest hospital casualty department immediately.
2. Take the bottle and any remaining suspension with you so that people can see what you have taken.
3. Do this even if you feel well.

If you forget to take Mebeverine

If you forget to take a dose take it as soon as you remember, but if it is almost time for your next dose, skip the missed dose and continue as usual.

Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose. If you have any further questions on the use of this product, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

STOP taking the suspension and **seek medical help immediately** if you have any of the following **allergic reactions**:

- ▶ difficulty breathing or swallowing, swelling of the face, lips, tongue or throat
- ▶ severe itching of the skin, with a red rash or raised lumps.

Reporting of side effects

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet. You can also report side effects directly via the Yellow Card Scheme Website: www.mhra.gov.uk/yellowcard or search for MHRA Yellow Card in the Google Play or Apple App Store. By reporting side effects you can help provide more information on the safety of this medicine.

5. How to store Mebeverine

- ▶ Keep this medicine out of the sight and reach of children.
- ▶ Do not use this medicine after the expiry date which is stated on the carton and bottle label after 'EXP'. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.
- ▶ Do not store above 25°C.
- ▶ Do not refrigerate or freeze.
- ▶ Discard 30 days after first opening.
- ▶ Do not use this medicine if you notice that the suspension becomes discoloured or shows any signs of deterioration. Seek the advice of your pharmacist.
- ▶ Do not throw away any medicines via wastewater or household waste. Ask your pharmacist how to throw away medicines you no longer use. These measures will help protect the environment.

6. Contents of the pack and other information

What Mebeverine Suspension contains

The active substance is mebeverine hydrochloride.

Each 5 ml of oral suspension contains 150 mg mebeverine hydrochloride (as pamoate).

The other ingredients are:

sodium benzoate (E 211), simeticone emulsion, microcrystalline cellulose and carmellose sodium, sodium citrate, citric acid monohydrate, polysorbate 20, macrogolglycerol 40 hydroxystearate, saccharin sodium, pamoic acid disodium salt monohydrate, banana flavour [contains propylene glycol (E1520)] and purified water.

What Mebeverine looks like and contents of the pack

Mebeverine is a yellow coloured suspension with banana flavour supplied in 125ml amber glass bottle with tamper-evident child-resistant white (polyethylene / polypropylene) plastic cap with EPE liner.

The pack also contains a 5ml oral syringe with 0.1ml intermediate graduation and a syringe adaptor.
