This medicine is available without prescription. However, you still need to use Canesten Bifonazole Once Daily Cream carefully to get the best results from it.

- If you have any unusual effects after using this product, tell your doctor or pharmacist.

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1. WHAT IS CANESTEN® BIFONAZOLE ONCE DAILY CREAM AND WHAT IS IT USED FOR?

Canesten Bifonazole Once Daily Athlete's Foot 1% w/w Cream is used to treat athlete's foot.

If you are unsure whether you have athlete's foot, seek the advice of your doctor or pharmacist.

The active substance in Canesten Bifonazole Once Daily is bifonazole. Bifonazole belongs to a group of medicines called imidazoles and is an antifungal agent which fights the cause of fungal skin infections.

2. BEFORE YOU USE CANESTEN® BIFONAZOLE ONCE DAILY CREAM

Do not use Canesten® Bifonazole Once Daily Cream:

- If you are allergic (hypersensitive) to bifonazole or any of the other ingredients of Canesten Bifonazole Once Daily Cream (*see section 6, Further Information*).
- To treat nappy rash. If your baby has nappy rash, seek your doctor's advice for a suitable treatment.
- To treat nail and scalp infections.
- To treat vaginal infections.

Before using Canesten® Bifonazole Once Daily Cream, you should seek the advice of your doctor or pharmacist if:

- you are unsure whether you have athlete's foot.
- you have ever had an allergic reaction to any antifungal product.

Important information about some of the ingredients:

This product contains cetostearyl alcohol which may cause local skin reactions (e.g. contact dermatitis). The medicine also contains 20mg benzyl alcohol in each gram of cream. Benzyl alcohol may cause allergic reactions and mild local irritation.
